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# 1 Important

## Safety

- (1) Read these instructions.
- (2) Keep these instructions.
- (3) Heed all warnings.
- Follow all instructions.
- (5) Do not use this apparatus near water.
- 6 Clean only with dry cloth.
- O not block any ventilation openings. Install in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.

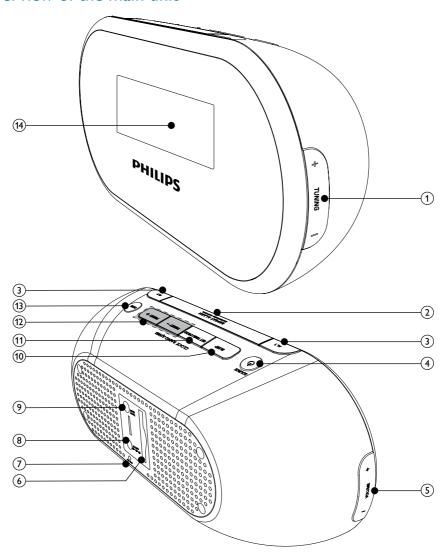

## Overview of the main unit



- 1 + TUNING -
  - Tune to a radio station.
- (2) REPEAT ALARM/BRIGHTNESS CONTROL
  - Repeat the alarm.
  - Adjust the brightness of display panel.

### (3) AL1, AL2

- Enable/disable the alarm timer.
- Activate the alarm time setup.
- View the alarm settings.

### (4) 0/SOURCE

- Turn on or off the unit.
- Switch between FM radio play, MP3 link input, and clock time display.

### (5) - VOLUME +

- · Adjust the volume level of radio.
- 6 Battery compartment
- (7) FM ANT
  - Attached FM radio antenna.
- (8) DC 5V
  - · Power supply socket.
- 9 MP3 LINK
  - Audio input jack (3.5 mm internal diameter) for an external audio device.
- (10) SLEEP
  - · Set the sleep timer.
- (11) SET TIME/PROG
  - · Activate the clock time setup.
  - · Program radio stations.
- (12) PRESET +/PRESET -
  - Adjust the date, clock time and alarm time.
  - · Select time format.
  - · Select a programmed radio station.
- (13) DATE
  - Display the preset time, month, day and year.
- (14) Display panel

# Activate the battery

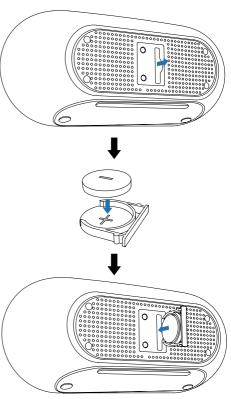


#### Caution

- Risk of explosion! Keep batteries away from heat, sunshine or fire. Never discard batteries in fire.
- Risk of product damage! When the apparatus is not used for long periods, remove the battery.
- Batteries contain chemical substances, so they should be disposed of properly.

Remove the protective tab to activate the battery.

### To replace the battery:



- 1 Open the battery compartment.
- 2 Insert one lithium CR2025 battery with correct polarity (+/-) as indicated.
- 3 Close the battery compartment.

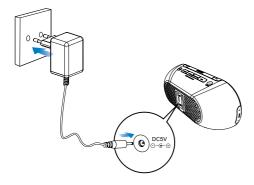
## Connect power



#### Caution

- Risk of product damage! Ensure that the power supply voltage corresponds to the voltage printed on the back or the underside of the apparatus.
- Risk of electric shock! When you unplug the AC power adapter, always pull the plug from the socket. Never pull the cord.
- Before connecting the AC power adapter, ensure you have completed all other connections.

- 1 Connect the power adapter to
  - the DC IN (DC 5V) jack on the back of the main unit, and
  - the power socket.



### Set time and date

- 1 In clock mode, press and hold SET TIME/ PROG for 2 seconds.
- 2 Press PRESET +/PRESET -.
  - → 12-hour or 24-hour format is selected.
- **3** Press **SET TIME/PROG** to confirm.
  - → The hour digits begin to blink.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the hour.
- **5** Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the minute.
- 6 Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the year.
- / Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the month.
- **8** Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the day.

### View the preset date

- 1 Press **DATE** repeatedly.
  - → The clock time, month, day and year are displayed consequently.

# 4 Listen to radio

### Tune to a radio station

- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to turn on the radio.
  - → FM and the current radio frequency appear.
- 2 Press +/- (on + TUNING -) repeatedly to tune to a radio station.

## Adjust the volume

1 Press +/- (on - VOLUME +) repeatedly.

# Program radio stations automatically



Note

- You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.
- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to turn on the radio.
- Press and hold SET TIME/PROG for 2 seconds.
  - All available stations are programmed in the order of waveband reception strength.
  - → The first programed radio station broadcasts automatically.

# Program radio stations manually



Note

- You can program a maximum of 20 preset radio stations.
- 1 Press SOURCE repeatedly to turn on the radio.
- 2 Press +/- (on + TUNING -) repeatedly to tune to a radio station.
- 3 Press SET TIME/PROG.
  - → The number begins to blink.
- 4 Press PRESET +/PRESET repeatedly to select a preset number.
- 5 Press **SET TIME/PROG** to confirm.
- **6** Repeat the above steps to program more stations.



Tip

 To overwrite a programmed station, program another station in its place.

### Select a preset radio station

- 1 Press **SOURCE** repeatedly to turn on radio.
- 2 Press PRESET +/PRESET to select a radio station.

# 5 Set the alarm timer

### Set the alarm time

You can set two alarms.



Note

- Before you start, ensure that the clock time is set correctly.
- 1 Press and hold AL1 (or AL2) for 2 seconds.
- 2 Press PRESET +/PRESET -.
  - → The alarm tone is selected.
  - **FM**:The preset radio station.
  - 8⊍22 :The buzz.
- 3 Press AL1 (or AL2) to confirm.
  - → The hour digits begin to blink.
- 4 Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the hour.
- **5** Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the minute.
- 6 Repeat steps 2 and 3 to set the volume level (32 maximum) of alarm tone.

## Turn on/off the alarm timer



Note

- Ensure that you already set the alarms successfully.
- 1 Press AL1 or AL2 twice.
  - → If the alarm timer is turned on, 4 or 4
    appears.
  - If the alarm timer is turned off, ♣ or ♣ disappears.

## View the alarm settings

1 Press AL1/AL2.

### Repeat alarm

- 1 When the alarm rings, press REPEAT ALARM/BRIGHTNESS CONTROL.
  - → The alarm repeats ringing 9 minutes later.

## Stop alarm ring

- 1 When the alarm rings, press the corresponding AL1 or AL2.
  - → The alarm stops but the alarm settings remain

# 6 Other features

## Set the sleep timer

You can set the radio to turn off automatically after a certain period of time.

- 1 Press **SLEEP** repeatedly to select a preset period of time.
  - → zz appears.
  - → The volume decreases gradually in the last 5 minutes.

### To turn off the sleep timer:

- 1 Press **SLEEP** repeatedly until <sup>OFF</sup> (off) appears.
  - → zz disappears.

## Adjust display brightness

1 Press REPEAT ALARM/BRIGHTNESS CONTROL repeatedly.

### Listen to an external device

You can use this unit to play audio from an external device.

- 1 Connect the MP3 link cable to
  - the MP3 LINK jack on the back of this unit, and
  - the audio output jack (usually the headphone socket) of the external device.
- Press SOURCE repeatedly to select the audio input from MP3 LINK jack.
  - → **and** une appear.
- 3 Press +/- (on VOLUME +) repeatedly to adjust the volume level.

### Warning

### No power

- Ensure that the Mains cord is connected securely.
- Ensure that there is power at the AC Mains.

#### No sound

Adjust the volume.

### No response from the unit

 Disconnect and reconnect the AC power plug, then turn on the unit again.

### Poor radio reception

- Increase the distance between the apparatus and yourTV orVCR.
- Fully extend the antenna.
- Connect an outdoor antenna instead.

### Timer does not work

- Set the clock correctly.
- Switch on the timer.

### Clock/timer setting erased

- Replace the battery.
- Power has been interrupted or the power plug has been disconnected.
- Reset the clock/timer



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
